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Anticoagulant Rodenticides Kill Far More Than Rodents

There are many casualties of anticoagulant rodenticides beyond targeted "pests." As the name implies, creatures ingesting these types of poisons suffer uncontrollable bleeding and a horrible death. The poisons are commonly used to kill rats or gophers and the people using them are often unaware that they may be killing their own household pets, their neighbors' pets or wildlife in the process.

In the last year, five dead owls have been found in our neighborhood by friends of my husband, Kirk, and me. Three were great horned owls. Two were barn

owls. South Bay Wildlife volunteers were heartbroken to hear the news. They hand raised several barn owls and released them nearby. Only two of these five owls were necropsied. Both died of poisoning (more than likely secondary poisoning from eating a rat or gopher that was poisoned).

Kirk took my mother's cat to

the veterinary emergency clinic a few weeks ago. A one year-old pregnant cat was brought in by her owners, bleeding profusely from her mouth. The cat could not be saved – another victim of anticoagulant rodenticides.

Several days later, one of our house painters told me that his Chihuahua had gotten out of the house and was missing for a couple of hours. People in his neighborhood commonly use rat poison and his dog ingested some while he was on his two-hour adventure. The dog died an awful death and the family was devastated. The Humane Society of the United States' website states that, in addition to owls and household pets, these rodenticides kill hawks, eagles, foxes, raccoons and squirrels. The Environmental Protection Agency has expressed concern about accidental human exposure as well. The American Association of Poison Control receives between 12,000 and 15,000 reports each year of children under the age of six being exposed.

Please think twice before using rodent poison. The Humane Society recommends that homeowners seal up cracks and holes leading into their homes and that live traps be used to relocate pests. Tomahawk Live Traps is a good source for rat and gopher traps. You can order them online at a reasonable price.

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Recent Dog Attack on Sorrel Ln.

I'd like to bring to the communities attention that on Monday February 17, 2014 at 3:40pm my 8 year old chihuahua, Bruno, was attacked and killed by the neighboring pit bull 'Kinsey' residing at 11 Sorrel Lane. This incident was discussed at length during that last DLPOA meeting March 5, 2014. Bruno was pulled off the bridal trail through the large gap in the fence and into the backvard of 11 Sorrel Lane by Kinsey. My 21 month old daughter was only a few feet away and she and I witnessed this horrific event. This is the 5th incident that we are aware of involving Kinsey attacking another neighborhood dog. We feel it's important that all local residents and boarders are aware of this potential danger and use extra caution when using the bridal trail between Sorrel Lane and Dapplegray Lane. The fence where Bruno was pulled through has been improved and is hopefully better able to prevent any future attacks. We would like to avoid any more tragedy! Kinsey remains in her owner's care where she is typically walked on leash without a muzzle or choke chain twice a day on our neighborhood streets often times around 8:30 in the morning and after dark. Be aware when you or your children are walking your dogs to steer clear of this very real danger!

This incident was reported to Animal Control that same night and an Officer came out to obtain statements from us as and from Kinsey's owners. There will be a hearing at the Animal Control office in Long Beach to to determine if Kinsey is a "potentially dangerous dog." The date of the hearing has not yet been determine. For those interested in attending the hearing, contact us so that we can give you the details of the hearing as soon as we get them.

We are reaching out to the Dapplegray Lanes residents to not only inform them of the tragic event that

took place and to use caution with your children and pets but also to present the opportunity to anyone who witnessed the event to come forward and provide any additional information. Also, if you have any personal experience with the dog behaving threateningly to your dog or even more importantly to any humans please get in touch with us. Please forward this information on to your boarders as well as they use the trails frequently and could be at risk if not made aware. There is an investigation taking place at this time and all pertinent information is being gathered in preparation for the upcoming hearing. 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Braised Ox Tongue With Star Anise

Serves/Makes: 6 | Difficulty Level: 3 | Ready In: 2-5 hrs

Ingredients:

1 tongue -- simmered for 1 hour

6 lardons (strips of pork fat from the belly), 1 1/2-inch size long and the thickness of a pencil

1 small onion -- chopped into small dice

1 small carrot -- chopped into small dice

1 stalk celery -- chopped into small dice

2 cloves garlic, chopped

olive oil

2 pieces pork skin from the belly -- 4 x 2 inches or thereabouts (optional)

1 cup red wine

4 cups chicken or beef stock

2 whole cloves

3 star anise


Directions:

Strip the partly cooked tongue of its membrane. Cut six holes at random and insert the lardons (a round and pointed object will help).

In a heavy-based pan sauté the onion, carrot, celery and garlic in a little oil and the pork skin, if using, until they are soft. Add the tongue and the red wine. Cook gently until the wine is almost gone. Add the cloves.

Add the stock, cover with a lid and cook gently for 2 hours, turning the tongue from time to time. Do not let the tongue dry out. Add water if you have to.

When it is soft - and the pork skin is so soft you can eat it with a spoon - remove the pot from the fire



As the tongue is resting skim the fat as it rises to the top. Do this well and systematically and you will not need to chill the sauce. This dish can be made ahead in which case the fat will set in the fridge. Skim off before reheating gently.
