Rancho Palos Verdes Storm Drain Repairs

While the Rancho Palos Verdes City Council has approved several million dollars for emergency storm drain repairs, complex regulations will result in this work taking almost two years to complete. No immediate emergency repairs are scheduled for Mediterrania.

However, with the rainy season upon us, we strongly encourage all residents of Mediterrania to make certain we are doing what we can to prevent storm drains from clogging up.

In addition, those of us who have lined concrete swales on our hillsides are required to ensure they don't become clogged as well as to repair them as needed.

Marymount Expansion Update

The final Scoping Session was held before the Planning Commission and the Traffic & Safety Commission on January 10th to determine what will be studied in the Environmental Impact Report (EIR). This was a very important and well-attended meeting. Oral comments addressed concerns regarding geological studies, parking, noise, and crime statistics, all of which will be studied in the EIR. The Draft EIR, if on schedule, should be ready for circulation to the public in April or May of this year. Draft EIR hearings will be held to verify whether everything submitted was studied, and whether the studies were sufficient.

An announcement was made at the beginning of the January 10th Scoping Session that Marymount has withdrawn the nursery school from its expansion plans. It will be permanently removed.

Another very important meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 31st, 7:00 p.m. at Hesse Park. This is a joint workshop between the RPV City Council and Marymount College. The public may comment about any and all aspects of the proposed expansion project. This meeting will not be limited to environmental issues. This is the first opportunity to tell the RPV City Council your thoughts and concerns on the Marymount Expansion Project. Mark your calendar for this very important meeting and be there.

- Marymount College, Auditorium


The MHOA will provide dinner to include salad, pizza, cookies and drinks.

Palos Verdes Drive East and Ganado Drive Intersection



The Rancho Palos Verdes Traffic & Safety Committee finally completed all parts of its plan to make the primary entrance into our neighborhood safer. Residents may notice that work crews recently finished the project, which included painting the curb red along the corner property on Ganado Drive/Palos Verdes Drive East to prohibit parking in the middle of the right-hand turn (south only) lane.

The turnout area just south of the intersection of Ganado Dr./Palos Verdes Drive East has also been painted. The curb has been painted red and major stripes throughout this area in conjunction with "No Parking At Any Time" in red make it most clear that no parking is allowed.

Finally, many of you have noticed, some have complained about, the "right-hand turn only" lane coming south on Palos Verdes Drive East as you approach Ganado Drive. In fact, so many drivers ignored the striping intended to make drivers merge left, that the city recently added bumps to remind drivers they must merge left first, then enter the right-hand turn only lane. Lois Karp, President MHOA, disagreed with this final plan approved by the city's Traffic Consultant Engineer and his decision to force drivers coming south to merge to the left just before turning to the right onto Ganado Drive. Unfortunately, the city makes the final safety decisions on all matters. Lois agreed to study the results in the months ahead. Your comments will be appreciated.

Treasurer's Report

This past year (2005) we had terrific neighborhood support for the HOA. Membership during 2005 grew to 148 households by the end of the year, which was a 28% increase over the prior year. I would like to thank all the households who have and continue to support our association. As for the new year, we already have 28 households who have paid their 2006 dues to date.

The Mediterrania Board of Directors works very closely with the City of RPV to be sure our area is well maintained and receives the required services. If you do not have an active homeowners association, there is no way to liaison with our city. In order to use one of our best-hidden resources, I created a committee post on our Board called City Reports for Tom Redfield. He attends more city meetings than anyone of us would even consider, and it is through his sharing of this information with our Board that we can truly keep on top of what is happening in our city and how it will affect Mediterrania. We are very proud that Mediterrania gave \$250 to the Portuguese Bend Preserve campaign. This was an opportunity of a lifetime to be part of preserving these beautiful areas in our community for future generations and us.

We also worked with the City of Rancho Palos Verdes to remove diseased trees from our tract. We coordinated with the Edison Company to remove illegal overhead lines between light poles on Hightide, and with Code Enforcement to verify permits were on file for homes undergoing a remodel. Board members and neighbors weeded and trimmed the entry landscaping, applied and received for a city grant to upgrade landscaping, and participated in many Traffic and Safety Commission meetings regarding the striping of Palos Verdes Drive East.

As part of our busy year, we tried very hard to work on items that you asked us to fix during the 2005 Annual Meeting. You asked us to make the voting process clearer, and to improve the newsletter. First, regarding the voting issues, we encouraged every member of our Association to participate in revising the bylaws by hand-delivering ballots to every household. The voting procedure will not be revised this year due to the fact that not enough ballots were returned to initiate a change. The Bylaw Amendment will reappear on the agenda at the 2006 Annual Meeting on January 28. Second, as regards the newsletter, I want to personally thank Nanette Babich for being our Newsletter Editor. This is an enormous job and I know you will all agree with me that she produced an informative and first class newsletter. Thank you Nanette.

Our Halloween Block Party, which is one of our major events each year, was a huge success. We had great weather, great food and adorable children enjoying the day's activities. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet and chat with neighbors. I was pleased that every member of our city council attended our event. It is a wonderful way to visit with and learn more about our city council members. This is one of the great benefits of living in RPV.
